3. Consideration of <u>Conditional Use Permit #21-0002</u> as submitted by Infra Towers, LLC, who proposes a modification of a previously approved 160-foot telecommunication tower. The project site is located at 373 E. Aten Road, Imperial, CA, on property identified as Assessor Parcel Number 044-230-014-000, and is further described as that portion of the north one-half of Tract 69, Township 15 South, Range 14 East, S. B.M., according to the plat of resurvey approved December 22, 1908, and filed in the District Land Office, (Supervisorial District #5) [Michael Abraham at (442) 265-1736, extension 1750 or by email at <u>michaelabraham@co.imperial.ca.us</u>]. David Black, Planner IV; read the PowerPoint Presentation of the project into the record.

David Lawrence Attorney for Infra Towers LLC, introduces himself & states address for the record.

David Lawrence; stated Infra Towers LLC has read, understand & accepts conditions of approval and does not have any question or concerns at this time.

Jurg Heuberger; stated that on behalf the Imperial County Historical Society Pioneer Museum board, they support approval of the tower. He added that it benefits the museum and that it benefits IVC because of the communication and they hope the board supports it as well.

Robert Menville; Stated he is also a member of the Imperial County Historical Society Pioneer Museum board. Added that they support the project since it will benefit the museum as well as the surrounding areas.

4A. Consideration of Water Supply Assessment (WSA) as submitted by Vikings Energy Farm, LLC proposing a Water Supply Assessment for the Vikings Solar Energy Generation and Storage project. This Water Supply Assessment has determined that IID has adequate polices, programs and project in place to provide water to agricultural, commercial, industrial and municipal users in the Imperial Unit. Adequate supply is currently available during normal water years. The foreseeable planned demands for the sources of water for the Project have been noted in this Water Supply Assessment. The proposed Project site is located on three parcels (APNs 050-070-018, 050,070,019 and 050-070-021-000). The project is located approximately 5.5 miles east of Holtville. Consideration of Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR 2021050036) and Findings, Consideration of the Vikings Solar Energy Generation and Storage project Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) that includes review of WSA, Mitigation Monitoring & Reporting (MM&RP) Program, CUP, and up to three (3) Lot Tie Agreements. The project proposes to generate approximately 150 MWs of solar and up to 300 MW of battery storage. The proposed Project site is located on three parcels (APNs 050-070-018, 050,070,019 and 050-070-021-000). The project is located approximately 5.5 miles east of Holtville. A mitigation monitoring and reporting program for mitigation measures that have been incorporated into or imposed upon the project to reduce or avoid significant effects on the environment (CCR §15097). This program will be designed to ensure that these measures are carried out during project construction and operation. The proposed Project site is located on three parcels (APNs 050-070-018, 050,070,019 and 050-070-021-000). The project is located approximately 5.5 miles east of Holtville. Consideration of Conditional Use Permit (CUP) #20-0025 as submitted by Vikings Energy Farm, LLC, proposing the Vikings Solar Energy Generation and Storage Project, which is an approximately 150 MW solar generation (PV) and up to 300 MW battery storage facility on approximately 604 acres located on three parcels (APNs 050-070-018, 050,070,019 and 050-070-021-000). The project is located approximately 5.5 miles east of Holtville. (Supervisor District #5) [David Black, Planner IV at (442) 265-1736, extension 1746 or by email at davidblack@co.imperial.ca.us].

Jim Minnick, Director; stated that <u>Agenda 4a-4d</u> stands approved for recommendation for the Board of supervisors by this commission, there is no appeal for this decision, The project will move forward to the board of supervisors.

5. Consideration of <u>Parcel Map #02489</u> as submitted by Felipe Irigoyen. Applicant is proposing a minor subdivision to create four parcels for a future development of a residential dwelling per parcel. Each parcel would be approximately 2.75 Acres for a project's total of approximately 11 Acres. The property is legally described as Blocks 49 and 50 of the Townsite of Holtville according to Map 908, Township 15 South, Range 15 East, S.B.M; Assessor's Parcel Numbers 045-580-001-000 (2360 Melon Rd., Holtville CA; Supervisorial District #5), [Mariela Moran, Planner III at (442) 265-1736 or by email at marielamoran@co.imperial.ca.us].

Jim Minnick, Director; gave a brief description of the project, and read the PowerPoint Presentation of the project into the record.

Mariela Moran, Planner III; read the PowerPoint Presentation of the project into the record.

Chairman Schaffner; Asked if there were any representatives of the project.

Jose Carlos Romero; Introduced himself, Engineer from Proterra representing the applicant. Requested a continuance for next hearing to further review the conditions recommended from public works dept. for installation of improvement of three streets that surround the project.

Chairman Schaffner; Gave a comment regarding the project, asking that hopefully they continue with the project since there is a shortage of housing in the area of Holtville.

Commissioner Cabanas; Asked what the conditions from public works dept. are.

Jim Minnick, Director; replied, public works is requiring improvement on those three roads.

Commissioner Cabanas; Asked engineer what their concerns are.

Jose Carlos Romero; Explained his concerns and how improving those streets would kill the project. Also how they are reviewing in debt, because of lack of time they were unable to review before, but they are reviewing what public works is basing those conditions on.

Chairman Schaffner; entertained a motion.
